According to these verses, a person either "has life" or "does not have life." There is no middle road. There is no working toward God and hoping to be good enough in the end.

The moment we trust in Christ, we are born again, and receive the gift of Eternal Life.

What Does it Mean to Believe?

To believe in Christ includes:

- Intellectual agreement I understand and agree I am a sinner, that God is righteous. I understand Jesus bore the penalty of my sin. He is offering me the gift of eternal life.
- Personal application This applies to me.
 I must choose to respond, to accept or reject the invitation of Christ.
- A <u>Decision</u> I choose to entrust my eternal destiny to Christ and to what He did for me on the cross.

"Believe in the Lord Jesus Christ, and you will be saved..." Acts 16:31

This is the most important decision of our lives - a decision that determines our eternal destiny!

"But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, even to those who believe in His name."

John 1:12

Section 2: Walking with Jesus

In section 1, we saw that our salvation is a transaction of God that is completed the moment we trust in Christ. There is nothing more for us to add to our salvation. There is nothing we must do to maintain our salvation. We have been "born again" into God's family. Our relationship with God is secure.

However with new life comes, well - a whole *New Life*. At its core, the Christian way of life is <u>a relationship with Jesus</u>. Every relationship has three dimensions, as does our relationship with the Lord.

1. The <u>Basis</u> of our Relationship

In most cases there is a defining event that establishes a relationship. (born into a family, a wedding, hired into a company, moved into a neighborhood)

For the believer, the defining event is the moment we were "born again" into God's family. This relationship is permanent.

2. The Current State of our Relationship

This addresses the experiential state, how the relationship is doing at the current time. (doing great, strained due to a conflict, not on speaking terms, physically separated)

For the believer, the experiential state of our relationship with Jesus is often expressed in terms of our "walk."

3. The Maturity Level of our Relationship

This describes the relationship as it grows over time. For the believer, our relationship with Jesus should grow.

The Walk of the Believer

The experiential state of the believer, our day to day relationship with the Lord, is the topic of much of the New Testament letters. What do the following verses say about our walk with the Lord?

Maintaining a Healthy Relationship with Jesus

Spend Time with the Lord

Every relationship in life is built through spending time together and sharing experiences. Time spent talking together is the life blood of a healthy relationship. The same holds true with our relationship with Jesus.

The Lord speaks to us through His Word, and we speak to Him through Prayer.

Walk by the Holy Spirit

To follow Jesus, and to live like Jesus is impossible on our own strength. The Christian walk is not about being religious and following a set of do's and don'ts.

Just as we were saved by God's grace, (He did all the work) so we are able to follow Jesus by God's grace. The enabling power to walk worthy of Christ is provided to the believer by the indwelling Holy Spirit. The moment we trusted in Christ, God sent the Holy Spirit to live in us:

1 Corinthians 6:19-20

Romans 5:5

1 John 3:24

We must now choose to "abide in Christ" by keeping His commands through the power of the Holy Spirit in us.

The Apostle Paul uses another "walk" passage to help us understand God's provision. Record your observations:

The Christian walk is not to be lived in isolation. The moment we trusted in Christ, we are placed into the "Body of Christ." This is one of the names used in Scripture for the church. It is a profound word picture. We can visualize a physical body, made up of many members, all connected and working together.

Section 3: Telling Your Story

We ended last session noting that as Jesus came to seek and to save the lost, He has sent believers out to continue His Kingdom work. As a new believer, this can be intimidating. "What if they don't believe me? What if I can't answer their questions? What if they ridicule or exclude me?"

Yet at the same time, we realize we have found eternal life through Jesus and we want our unsaved friends to come to know Christ. Consider the story of the Samaritan Woman:

John 4:7-30

vs 28-29 What did she do after she spoke with Jesus?

vs 30, 39 What was the result?

Note: the woman had been saved one day. She hadn't taken any "evangelism classes." She had a story to tell of how Jesus changed her life.

You also have a story to tell.

Mark 5:1-20

vs 19 What did Jesus instruct him to do?

vs 20 What was the result?

Note: the man had been saved one day, yet Jesus sent him to go to the people he already knew, and tell them his story. Not everyone will respond, but no one can deny our story.

Fishers of Men

While Jesus was on earth, He gave a profound invitation:

Matthew 4:19

Let's take a closer look:

What is the Condition?

What is His Promise?

Through a process (of following Him) Jesus <u>will change</u> <u>us</u> into something (a fisher of men).

Develop the fishing analogy:

How does a fisherman prepare?

What equipment is needed?

Why is bait needed? How is bait used?

How important is the time & place in fishing?

Will a fisherman always catch fish?

What is it like when you DO catch a fish?

Make the connections between fishing and reaching lost people

Why is this so Hard?

As Ambassadors of Christ, we carry the most important message in the world. The Gospel Message is the only invitation with eternal consequences. Everyone needs to hear and respond to the Gospel!

So why is it so hard to share our faith?

We are Afraid.

It is true, we can expect rejection and opposition to the Gospel. Jesus warned us: John 15:18

Peter warned us: 1 Peter 3:13-14 The early church: Acts 4:1-4; 8:1-4

Yet as Jesus gave His command, He reminded the disciples of His ultimate authority. Matt 28:18

We fail to see the Urgency.

Jesus is the only way: Acts 4:12; 1 Tim 2:5-6 We will all face Jesus: as our Savior, John 14:1-6 or as our Judge, Luke 16:19-31; Acts 17:30-31

We fail to Love People as Jesus Loves.

People are dying, they need Jesus, Matt 9:36-38 Jesus wept over Jerusalem, Luke 19:41-42

We are in a Spiritual War.

The believer has an enemy, 1 Peter 5:8-9 He is blinding unbelievers, 2 Cor 4:4

Yet, there is no greater privilege than to participate in God's Kingdom work of reaching the lost, work that will have eternal reward.

Preparing Your Story

The Samaritan woman did not have any training, but she had a story. She immediately went out and told people she knew what Jesus had done in her life.

If you have trusted in Christ, you have a story to tell. It may not be a story that will make it into a best selling book, but it is your story. It is unique to you. It is real, and no one can deny your story. There is no theological debate.

Consider these examples:

John 9:13-38

vs 25 "This I know, I was blind, but now I see."

Our Story typically has Three parts

- 1) My Life before Christ
- 2) How I came to find Christ
- 3) My Life after I Trusted in Christ

Notice Paul's story has three parts:

Acts 22:1-22

vs 1-5 Life before Christ

vs 6-16 How Paul found Christ (or Christ found him)

vs 17-21 Life after Trusting in Christ

Acts 26:4-22

vs 4-11 Life before Christ

vs 12-18 How Paul found Christ

vs 19-23 Life after Trusting in Christ

Refining My Story

Practice and Refine Your Story

Every time you meet together, have someone practice telling their story.

- Keep it Concise and Focused, You should have a 3 minute version
- 2) Leave Out Insignificant Details, No one cares!
- 3) Don't use "Christian" jargon, spirit moving, altar call, saved, etc.
- 4) Be Humble, You were saved by Grace! "Now I have my act together, but you are still a sinner." Wrong Approach!
- 5) Don't pull in theological issues. "I used to be a Catholic and they teach..." This is not a debate, this is your unique story of what Jesus did in your life.

Who Needs to Hear Your Story?

The Samaritan woman went back to <u>her city</u> to tell her story. Jesus instructed the demon possessed man to go back to <u>his people</u> and tell them what He had done.

God has brought within your sphere of influence people who are lost and need Jesus. They need to hear your story.



Record the key points

3 Circles, Spiritual Conversation

There are hundreds of tools, models, and illustrations one can use to share the Gospel. One effective approach is to use the 3 Circles model.

This model starts with establishing a connection point, our brokenness, then presents God's love, what God has done about our brokenness, and finally how we can respond and be restored.




It is best to start a spiritual conversation by <u>asking</u> <u>questions and listening</u>. Find out where they are at, what is the hurt or struggle in their life. What is their religious background. This may lead into a connection point of Brokenness.

Circle I: Brokenness

Just about every casual conversation will at some point include a discussion of something that is not right. A world situation, a crime, a broken marriage, a sick child. All of these are evidences of a world that is broken and can be a starting point for a spiritual conversation.

Listen carefully to hear their personal expression of brokenness, and the trials they are going through. Carefully ask questions to identify what they are doing to find relief or escape from their brokenness.

Attempts to Fix our Brokenness




Brokenness and emptiness are a result of sin. Be careful to listen. You may be able to share your story of how you tried to deal with your brokenness before you trusted in Christ. Ask if you can share a diagram that helps find an answer.

Circle 2: God's Perfect Design

The second circle represents God's heart and perfect design. Things were not always broken, in fact when God created the world, it was perfect, no suffering, disease or death.

God created mankind to have a relationship with Him. But a love relationship requires freedom to choose. God created mankind with the freedom to accept or reject Him.

Sadly, we have chosen to reject God, and live our own lives independent from Him. The Bible calls this sin. Our rejection of God has resulted in brokenness.



Our sin has separated us from God. God is holy and righteous, He cannot compromise His perfect character. He must punish sin. Man is unable, by our own efforts to restore our relationship with God. No amount of good works will remove our sin.


But there is GOOD NEWS!

Circle 3: Jesus

God sent Jesus into the world to save us by dying for our sins. He lived a sinless life, which qualified Him to take on the penalty of our sins. When Jesus was on the cross, our sins were poured out on Him, He bore the penalty of our sins. As proof that He is who He claimed to be, He rose from the dead after three days.

He Himself bore our sins in His body on the cross, so that we might die to sin and live to righteousness...

1 Peter 2:24




Jesus has removed the penalty of our sin. God now offers everyone the gift of Eternal Life, a restored relationship with God. We receive His gift by faith, by trusting in Christ.

Restored & Sent

The moment we place our trust in Christ, we are "born again." Our relationship with God is forever restored. We now have the opportunity and privilege to grow in our relationship with Christ.

Once we have been restored, Jesus tells us to GO BACK into the world that is broken to share with others the love, hope and healing found only in Him.




Practice Telling God's Story

Every time you meet together, have someone practice presenting the Gospel.

The Bridge Illustration

The Bridge illustration is a simple way to walk through Romans 6:23. It is one of the most used illustrations to present the Gospel.



For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord. Romans 6:23
